he Russian invasion of Ukraine sent shockwaves across the world. and as Russia continues breaching Ukraine's sovereignty by expanding eastwards and displacing millions of refugees in the process, uncertainty looms over what the future holds for the Ukrainian people. What has remained certain, however, is the international community's solidarity with Ukraine.

Moscow has been sanctioned and boycotted by actors ranging from governments to international organizations to even major corporations. The West has agreed to exclude Russian banks from the international payment system SWIFT, the Society for Worldwide Interbank Financial Telecommunication. This move will disconnect Russia from the international financial system, severely damaging their economy.1 Multinational corporations like Starbucks and McDonalds, engaging in a form of boycott, have halted operations in Russia.2
